

MCC Netball Mid Season Report

What an exciting year 2018 has been for MCC Netball. We registered 22 teams with NSNA, a clear indication of the increasing support for netball and the growth of the game at Mercy.

Heading in to round 8 we have 17 of our 22 teams who are placed in a top 4 position. It is clear that all the work put in to grading, team selection and coach recruitment early in the year is paying off.

It is also encouraging to see those teams outside of these figures who have improved dramatically since Game 1. None more evident than our MCC14 and MCC07 teams. MCC14 were elevated 2 grades to be placed in 14A this year and have faced the challenge head on.

After a slow start the girls have come together to produce netball of a high standard proving they are more than worthy of their place in A grade. MCC07 had unexpected changes early on in their team but have shown a commitment to work hard at training resulting in improved skill sets and team play. Games are tough and long but they always walk off with a handshake for the opposition and a smile on their face! A true example of winning isn't everything!

As with all sporting associations MCC rely heavily on volunteers who give up their time and expertise to coach, manage, umpire and coordinate games ensuring Mercy students are able to participate in a co curricular team sport with their cohort. These volunteers do much more than attend a game each week and without them MCC Netball would not function. They deserve our full thanks and admiration.

Unfortunately we have had a couple of incidents at the courts recently involving our spectators that do not reflect our Mercy values. As in all team sports there are correct procedures to follow if any type of issue or dispute arises. At **no** point is any spectator ever to approach an umpire. The captain of the team playing is the only one who is to speak to the umpire, only at a break and only to discuss a rule or clarify a call.

If necessary there is always an MCC Netball representative at the courts who can be called on to attend a game. They are then able to determine if an NSNA official is required.

The Coach or Manager are the only people who should call for officials. Parents, players and spectators are reminded of the Code of Conduct agreed to when registering for Netball.

We hope the rest of the season is a positive and rewarding experience for all involved in Netball and look forward to seeing lots of supporters at future games to watch the Mercy girls in action!

Getting started!

Step 1. Download *Qkr!* **on your Android phone or iPhone Via <u>App Store</u> or <u>Google Play</u> iPad users can download iPhone App.**

Step 2: Register

Select your Country of Residence as 'Australia' and follow the steps to register

Step 3: Find Mercy Catholic College, Chatswood

Search for Mercy Catholic College or Chatswood

Step 4: Register your Child/ren

When first accessing your school menu; you will be prompted to register your child. This allows you to make school payments on their behalf.


